# Keynote Speakers

## Dr. Michael W. Higgins

Presenting on Thursday, June 3, 2010



Visiting Senior Executive in Residence at Sacred Heart University, Fairfield, CT

### *Catholic Education: Variations, Iterations, and Perturbations*

Catholic Education is not a regional or even national undertaking; it is extraterritorial; it is global. This is its genius and its challenge. What is the Canadian contribution to this universal ministry?

Dr. Michael William Higgins is an author, broadcaster, Vatican affairs specialist, columnist and long-time Catholic educator, scholar and administrator. From 1973-82 Dr. Higgins taught English at St. Michael's College School, Theology and Religious Studies at the University of St. Michael's College, Erindale College, and St. Paul University in Ottawa. He served in various capacities as a professor of English and Religious Studies at St. Jerome's University in the University of Waterloo, including terms as a Chair, Associate Dean, Vice-President and President. He assumed responsibilities as President and Vice-Chancellor of St. Thomas University in Fredericton, NB in 2006. On January 1, 2010, Dr. Higgins assumed new duties as Visiting Senior Executive in Residence at Sacred Heart University, Fairfield, CT.

Dr. Higgins has edited and co-edited, authored and co-authored, eleven books including: *Portraits of Canadian Catholicism*, *My Father's Business: A Biography of His Eminence G. Emmett Cardinal Carter*, *The Jesuit Mystique*, *Power and Peril: The Catholic Church at the Crossroads*, the award-winning *Heretic Blood: The Spiritual Geography of Thomas Merton*, *The Muted Voice: Religion and the Media*, and *Stalking the Holy: The Pursuit of Saint-Making*.

Dr. Higgins also has an extensive media record. He was a monthly columnist for the *Toronto Star* from 1986 to 2006 and a weekly columnist for *The K-W Record*. He is currently a regular contributor to *The Globe and Mail*, *The Literary Review of Canada*, and *Commonweal*. As a radio documentarian for the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation, he has prepared over sixty one-hour scripts for *Ideas*, *Celebration*, and *Testament* and has been a regular contributor to *Morningside*, *This Morning*, *Sunday Edition*, as well as to CTV's *Canada AM* and to TV Ontario's *Studio 2* and *Agenda*. Dr. Higgins was the chief consultant for John McGreevy's six-hour television series, *Sir Peter Ustinov's Inside the Vatican*, and for John Bailey's film of Ron Hansen's novel, *Mariette in Ecstasy*. He has also served as a consultant for CBC's *Man Alive*.

Dr. Higgins and his wife Krystyna, a professional piano accompanist, liturgical musician and freelance editor, have four children.

## Professor Mark McGowan

### *Standing on the Shoulders of Giants: Catholic Education Faces the Third Millennium*

Mark G. McGowan is a Professor of History at the University of Toronto and Principal of St. Michael's College at that same institution. A specialist in the religious, migration, and

educational history of Canada, he published *The Waning of the Green: Catholics, the Irish and Identity in Toronto, 1887-1922* (McGill-Queen's, 1999), *Michael Power (1804-1847): The Struggle to Build the Catholic Church on the Canadian Frontier* (McGill-Queen's, 2005), and *Creating Canadian Historical Memory: The Case of the Famine Migration of 1847* for the Canadian Historical Association (2006).

He has just published a book, *Death or Canada: The Irish Famine Migration to Toronto, 1847*, (Novalis, 2009), which is partnered with an Ireland-Canada co-production feature length documentary of the same name, which aired History Channel and RTE in Ireland. Currently, Mark is researching a history of religion and broadcasting in Canada, 1918-1968.

In Ontario Catholic school circles he is better known for his public advocacy for Catholic education and for his booklet, *The Enduring Gift* which offers a brief overview of the history of Catholic education in the Province. The father of five children, Mark and his wife Eileen live in Whitby, Ontario.

*“On this hilltop overlooking the Ottawa River, parliamentarians gather to make the laws of the land. The Parliament Buildings – which include the Centre Block, East Block and West Block – house the Senate and the House of Commons chambers, the Library of Parliament, and offices for parliamentarians and staff. Construction began on these buildings in 1859, and today is among the finest examples of Gothic Revival architecture in North America.”*

Both newcomers to the city and people familiar with our Capital will enjoy this tour of Ottawa’s downtown core. Walk will include Parliament Hill, the National War Memorial, Major’s Hill Park, the Supreme Court, the Bank of Canada, the Rideau Canal, the Prime Minister’s Offices, the ByWard Market and other points of interest. Rain or shine.

## Rideau Canal Boat Tour

Enjoy the best view possible of one of the engineering marvels of the nineteenth century, the Rideau Canal, now a UNESCO World Heritage Site. A bilingual and live commentary will highlight the sites along the canal, to include the National Arts Centre, University of Ottawa, Lansdowne Park, Carleton University, Experimental Farm, Dow’s Lake and much more. Boat launch located directly behind the Conference Centre (5-10 minute walk across the street from the Château Laurier)

## Museum of Civilization, IMAX, and Canadian War Museum Pass

Time: Independent tour, no set departure time  
Details: Ticket is valid for 3 days to be used *once* in each of the attractions; Museum of Civilization; IMAX theatre; and Canadian War Museum. Individuals will be responsible for their own transportation (i.e. walk, taxi, bus).

**Museum of Civilization** Explore 1,000 years of Canadian history, as you travel through life-sized townscapes and environments from across the country, and meet some of Canada’s most remarkable figures. Discover a traditional West Coast Aboriginal village, and take in the world’s largest indoor collection of totem poles. Approximately 30-minute scenic walk from Major’s Hill Park (behind the Chateau Laurier), National Gallery, across the Alexandria Bridge. **IMAX Theatre** is located inside the Museum of Civilization.

**The Canadian War Museum** takes you on an exciting journey through the personal, national and international dimensions of Canada’s military history. The museum’s unparalleled collection – ranging from medals and works of art to military artillery, including a CF-Voodoo jet fighter – brings home the moving first-hand accounts of the women, men and children who lived through conflicts. Approx. 30-minute scenic walk along Wellington Street, past the Parliament buildings, Supreme Court Building, National Archives to location on the Ottawa River Parkway.

Time: Bus departs on the hour, every hour, from 10:00 am to 3:00 pm

Details: Bus tour departs from Elgin Street & Sparks Street, which is a 5-10 minute walk from the Château Laurier.

Complete loop takes approximately 2 hours. Due to the flexible time of tours, individuals should arrive 15 minutes prior to tour departure. Passengers are able to hop off the bus tour at any of the attractions and can hop on at the same location they were dropped off, or at the other various marked locations.

One of the most popular, fun and informative ways to tour the City of Ottawa is aboard the "Hop-On Hop-Off" classic double-decker bus. Sit on the first floor and enjoy the inside comfort or ride on the second floor and enjoy the fantastic views. The bilingual guided tours will let you "hop off" at the sites you want to explore and "hop back on" as many times through the day to resume your adventure tour. All this at your own pace over 3 days. The City tour bus departs Elgin & Sparks Street (*Parliament Buildings, National War Memorial, National Arts Centre*) and stops at: The Canadian War Museum, The Canadian Museum of Civilization, Rideau Hall (*Governor General Residence*), RCMP Musical Ride, National Aviation Museum, National Gallery of Canada (*Royal Canadian Mint, Notre Dame Basilica, Peacekeeping Monument*), ByWard Market, Dows Lake (*Experimental Farm*), Museum of Nature, returning to Elgin & Sparks Street.

## Companion Tours - Friday, June 4, 2010

### Rideau Hall Tour with Lunch at Mackenzie King Estate

Cost: \$45.00 per person (*price includes GST*)

Time: 9:00 am to 3:30 pm

Details: Bus departs Château Laurier at 9:15 am (Mackenzie Street foyer), then stops at Les Suites Hotel. Guests will be required to pass through security upon arrival at Rideau Hall. Lunch is provided in the Mackenzie King Tearoom at 12:15 pm (consisting of soup, a salad/sandwich plate and tea/coffee). The guided tour of the Estate grounds and buildings begins at 1:30 pm. Departure from the Estate will be at 3:00 pm for return to Ottawa.

**Rideau Hall** is the official residence and workplace of every governor general since 1867. This heritage site is a national gathering place, where the governor general lives, honours Canadians for their excellence, hosts foreign dignitaries and performs the functions of Canada's Head of State, as the representative of the Crown in Canada.

Rideau Hall is the largest official residence in Canada's Capital Region and the only one open to the public. The residence houses rooms for State functions, offices and other work spaces, including kitchens, and a greenhouse run by the National Capital Commission (NCC) where plants and flowers are grown for use in all six official residences.

Heads of State and royalty stay at Rideau Hall during visits to Ottawa. Most recently, in 2002, Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II stayed at Rideau Hall, during the Golden Jubilee, commemorating the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of her Accession to the Throne.

As a working residence, Rideau Hall serves many official functions. Almost every prime minister and cabinet has been sworn in at Rideau Hall since Sir John A. Macdonald in 1867. Canadians from across the country are honoured with various awards celebrating excellence and achievement.

**The Mackenzie King Estate** was the country retreat of Prime Minister William Lyon Mackenzie King. Notable visitors to the estate were Winston Churchill, Yousuf Karsh and Charles Lindberg. Nestled in the tranquility of Gatineau Park, the Estate offers restored cottages, beautiful gardens complete with stone ruins, walking trails, and a tea room serving light refreshments. Mackenzie King also restored an old farmhouse as a permanent residence, where he enjoyed the role of gentleman farmer. "The Farm" was Mackenzie King's last residence and now serves as the official residence of the Speaker of the House of Commons. When Mackenzie King died in 1950, he bequeathed his property at Kingsmere to the people of Canada.

### Steam Train Excursion to Wakefield, Quebec

Built in 1907, the country's oldest excursion locomotive carries thousands of visitors, rail fans, nature lovers and adventurers to the picturesque tourist village of Wakefield.

Relax comfortably in climate-controlled cars and let the sounds of the steam whistle and the "clickety clack" of the wheels carry you back to a by-gone era; a memorable and fun-filled journey for the entire family. A boxed lunch is included.
